Having read this waiver and knowing these facts and in the consideration of your accepting my entry, I, for myself and anyone entitled to act on my behalf, waive and release the Juniata Valley Striders running club, Road Runners Club of America, Derry Township and all race sponsors and their representatives and successors, from all claims or liabilities of any kind arising out of my participation in this event, even though that liability may arise out of negligence or carelessness on the part of the persons named in this waiver.

## MCSD Homelessness Pantry

The Mifflin County School District, in conjunction with the Association of Mifflin County Educators, maintains a Homelessness Pantry. Student homelessness is an issue for all school districts, including Mifflin County. Precipitating events that lead to homelessness include abandonment, natural disaster, death of a parent or guardian, domestic violence, eviction, fire, hospitalization of a parent or guardian, incarceration of a parent or guardian, decrease or loss of income or separation from family. Many negative social and academic outcomes may be associated with student homelessness.

Students and their families who are classified as homeless can receive supplies and support from the district's Homelessness Pantry. Below are a list of current items that would most benefit the Homelessness Pantry:
