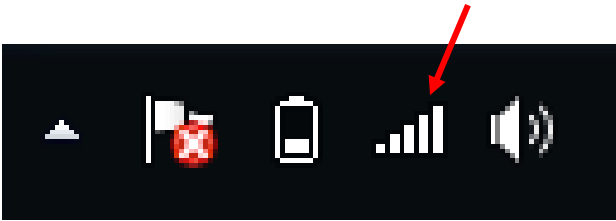
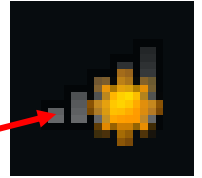


Connecting to MCSD Wifi

1. Open the Internet connection options by clicking the icon in the Windows Notification Area.

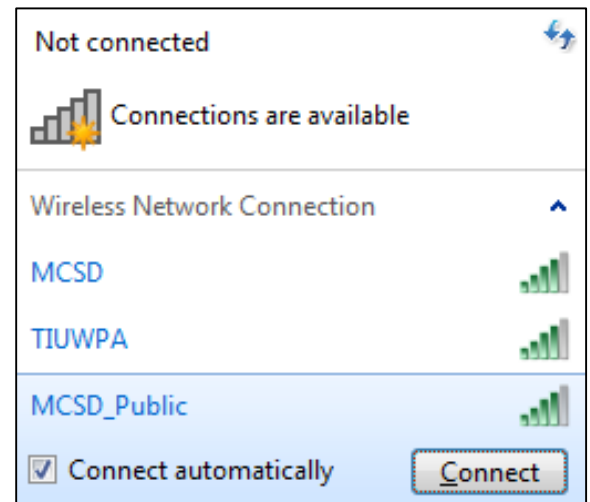


Since you most likely are not connected to any network, your icon may display as this:



2. Choose **MCSD_Public**. If you put a checkmark in the box to connect automatically, when you bring your device to school again, it will automatically connect to this network and you will begin at step #6.

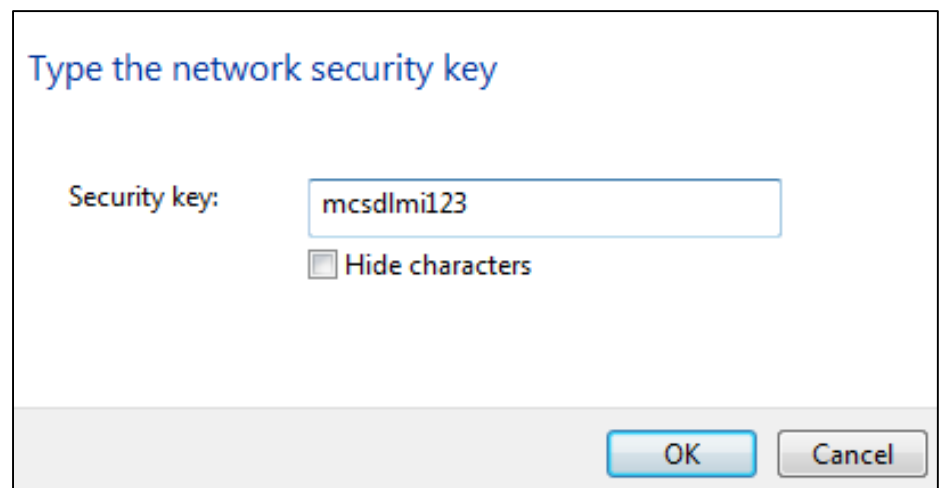
3. Press **Connect**.



4. You will be prompted to enter the network security key.



5. Press **OK**.



6. As soon as you open the Internet, you will be prompted to log in. Enter your **Username and Password** just as you would to log on to an MCSD computer.

7. Press **Submit**. You then can surf the Internet.


