2020 PSSA Testing Dates

The Math and Reading PSSA tests will be given to the 3rd – 5th graders this year.

- **The English Language Arts testing window is April 20 - 24.**
- **The Math testing window is April 27 – May 1.**
- **The Science Testing window is May 4 - 8. (4th Grade only.)**

It is important for students to be in school during this time. Please try not to **schedule appointments or vacations during these dates.**

MTSS. What is it and how does it affect my child?

Wouldn't it be great if each individual child received support at school for his or her specific needs? Your mind might go straight to academic needs, like reading and math since that is the backbone of education. But, wouldn't it be exceptional to also include social and behavioral support along with academic support? In the Mifflin County School District, Indian Valley Elementary School supports all of these important parts of a child's needs with the goal of helping them become a well-rounded individual.

Indian Valley's faculty and staff have been working hard over the past few years to incorporate a new and very specific system to help identify the needs and provide individualized support to our students. This system is called a Multi-Tiered System of Support (MTSS) and it helps us look deep into each student's academic, social, and behavioral needs so we know what kind of support to give to each child. Under this Multi-Tiered System of Support, the "tiered" portion refers to the amount of support a child is given. Because each child is different, the amount of support he or she needs is also different. As educators, we know that a child's behavior and social skills can have a tremendous effect on academics. As a school community, our goal is to help students become the best well-rounded person he or she can be.

Response to Instruction and Intervention (RtII) is the part of MTSS that focuses primarily on academic needs. This RtII structure is the new way to think about identifying if a child has a specific learning disability. If a child is not responding to reading instruction – using high quality reading programs that are research-based and tested – we will then consider going further with doing more evaluations to find if the child has a specific learning disability. Before we do that, we meet with the parents to get a broad picture of the child, we look at all the data we have on the child, then decide together, as a team, if we are going to go further with the process in identifying the child with a learning disability.

Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) is the part of MTSS that focuses on social-emotional and behavioral needs. This piece is included because we know that a child's behavior and social skills can have a tremendous effect on academic success. All children need instruction on the proper ways to behave. The PBIS system allows children to know and understand what behaviors are expected when they are in various parts of the school. We start this during the first few days of the school year by teaching and modeling for them the exact behaviors and procedures that are expected. We also have strategies in place for students that might need extra support and guidance with behavior or social skills. With the PBIS system comes an acknowledgment system in which students receive 3RS tickets when they are seen meeting these expectations of respectful, responsible, ready, and safe behavior. Students have the chance to "win" special rewards by placing their tickets into buckets under the "prize" that they want to earn. Each classroom has their own set goal for number of 3RS tickets to reach to earn a classroom celebration. We also have a school-wide goal with the reward being a whole school PBIS celebration.

As educators, we know that a child's behavior and social skills can have a tremendous effect on their academics. As a school community, including all faculty and staff, our goal is to help students become the best well-rounded person they can be.
