Important Information

Remember to update your Skylert information.

It is critical that all emergency contact information is up to date. Please contact the office if phone numbers change or there is a change in court ordered custody.

Be sure to submit a "Permission to Give Medication" form for students who need to take meds/inhalers at school.

Students are able to take up to 5 Educational Trip days per school year. Be sure to fill out the form and have it signed PRIOR to taking the educational trip. A report is due to the office within 3 days of returning from the trip for it to be considered a lawful absence.

Right to Know

As a parent of a student attending a school that is receiving Federal Title I dollars, you have the right to know the professional qualifications of the teacher(s) and instructional paraprofessional(s) who instruct your child.

Federal law requires every Title I school district to comply and to provide you with the requested information in a timely manner.

We are happy to provide this information to you. At any time, you may ask:

- Whether the teacher met state qualifications and certification requirements for the grade level and subject he/she is teaching,
- Whether the teacher received an emergency or conditional certificate through which state qualifications were waived, and
- What undergraduate or graduate degrees the teacher holds, including graduate certificates and additional degrees, and major(s) or area(s) of concentration.

You may also ask whether your child receives help from a paraprofessional. If your child receives this assistance, we can provide you with information about the paraprofessional's qualifications.

The Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) which was signed into law in December 2015 and reauthorizes the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1956 (ESEA) includes additional right to know requests. At any time, parents and family members can request:

- Information on policies regarding student participation in assessments and procedures for opting out, and
- Information on required assessments that include
 - subject matter tested,
 - purpose of the test,
 - source of the requirement (if applicable),
 - amount of time it takes students to complete the test, and
 - time and format of disseminating results.

Our staff is committed to helping your child develop the academic knowledge and critical thinking he/she needs to succeed in school and beyond. That commitment includes making sure that all of our teachers and paraprofessionals meet applicable Pennsylvania state requirements.

Important Reminders

- ✓ All kindergarten students **MUST** have a parent/guardian at the bus stop or the bus driver **WILL NOT** let the child off the bus.
- ✓ A written excuse is due to the main office within three days of the student absence. Failure to submit an excuse can result in an unexcused absence.
- ✓ If your child is **NOT** to ride the bus on a given day, a note is needed, otherwise students will be placed on their bus as usual. If an emergency arises or you forget to submit a note, please contact the school prior to 1:30pm so that proper notification can be provided to the classroom teacher.
- ✓ Please **DO NOT** drop your child off before 7:45AM. There are no teachers on duty until that time. Pick-up time for students who are not riding the bus home is 2:50PM.



Remote Friday computer lab availability:

If you are unable to log into Class Dojo (Grades K-3) or Google Classroom (Grades 4-5) to complete Remote Friday assignments due to internet connectivity issues, you may call the school in advance of a Remote Friday to sign your child up for a computer lab session. Transportation is not provided by the district. Times offered are 8-10am, 10-12pm, and 12:30-2:30pm. Limited space will be available.

Help for the Homeless

If you know of a family who has school-aged children and is currently homeless, please let them know that there is help available. Each school in the Mifflin County School District has a school counselor who can direct the family in the right direction.

A student is considered homeless if he/she is lacking a fixed, regular, or adequate nighttime residence. Families may become homeless for a variety of reasons. Our concern is for the health and well-being of the family unit and the education of the children. With that in mind, the Mifflin County School District has received countless boxes of donations of clothing, toiletries, school supplies, and other items. Our school counselors have access to those items.

Homelessness is a sensitive subject; therefore, we are asking that those who may need assistance reach out to Mrs. Campbell, our school counselor. She can make sure the needs of the students and family are met. She also may know of other resources through the community that would be of help to the family. If you know someone who is homeless but does not attend Indian Valley, please encourage him or her to reach out to the school counselor at their child's school. Our goal is to make an unfortunate situation tolerable for the family.

Tutoring

Indian Valley is looking to provide after-school tutoring to students during the 2020–2021 school year. Tutoring will be offered on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 3:00-4:30pm beginning the week of September 25th.

- Parents/Guardians will need to provide transportation home from tutoring.
- Classroom teachers will begin to create a list of students who want to participate in tutoring.
- Please make your child's classroom teacher aware if you have interest in your child attending the after-school tutoring program.
