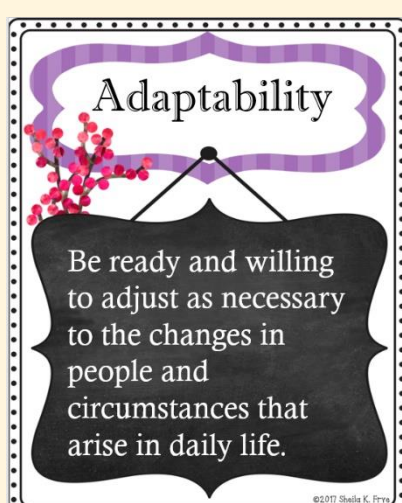
We would like to introduce the new staff or changes at Indian Valley Elementary Center:

Respectful, Responsible, Ready, and Safe - - - The PBIS Way!

The Indian Valley PBIS Team is excited to kick off another year of promoting "pawsitive" behaviors within our school! During the week of September 7th, all students will participate in lessons to review RESPECTFUL, RESPONSIBLE, READY, and SAFE expectations across all settings in the building. Ask your child to let you know when they receive PAW tickets!



Leader of the Pack: Each month, every teacher will award one student in his/her class the "**Leader of the Pack Ticket**" for showing exceptional behavior as related to the month's character trait. In September, the entire student body will focus on ADAPTABILITY. Adaptability means being ready and willing to adjust as necessary to the changes in people and circumstances that arise in daily life.

When a student wins the "**Leader of the Pack Ticket**," he/she is recognized with a certificate and spirit stick from the principals. The student is also given a random space on the Principal's 200 Club bulletin board outside the office. Once a row or column is filled with names, those students win a special prize.

Reminders:

- ✓ All kindergarten students **MUST** have a parent/guardian at the bus stop or the bus driver **WILL NOT** let the child off the bus.
- ✓ A written excuse is due to the main office within three days of the student absence. Failure to submit an excuse can result in an unexcused absence.
- ✓ If your child is **NOT** to ride the bus on a given day, a note is needed. Otherwise, students will be placed on their bus as usual. If an emergency arises or you forget to submit a note, please contact the school prior to 1:30pm so that proper notification can be provided to the classroom teacher.
- ✓ Please **DO NOT** drop your child off before 7:45AM. There are no teachers on duty until that time. Pick-up time for students who are not riding the bus home is 2:50PM.

Tier 2 Behavioral Supports:

Indian Valley has systems in place to identify and assist students in need of behavioral supports. Each month, a Tier 2 team analyzes discipline referrals to determine if students are in need of more support. If your child has frequent "minor" discipline referrals or any "major" discipline referrals, a team member will be in contact for parent permission to help eliminate barriers and assist the student. Parents may also reach out to their child's teacher or the school counselor to see if Tier 2 supports may be of assistance.

Right to Know

As a parent of a student attending a school that is receiving Federal Title I dollars, you have the right to know the professional qualifications of the teacher(s) and instructional paraprofessional(s) who instruct your child. Federal law requires every Title I school district to comply and to provide you with the requested information in a timely manner. We are happy to provide this information to you. At any time, you may ask:

- Whether the teacher met state qualifications and certification requirements for the grade level and subject he/she is teaching,
- Whether the teacher received an emergency or conditional certificate through which state qualifications were waived, and
- What undergraduate or graduate degrees the teacher holds, including graduate certificates and additional degrees, and major(s) or area(s) of concentration.

You may also ask whether your child receives help from a paraprofessional. If your child receives this assistance, we can provide you with information about the paraprofessional's qualifications. The Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), which was signed into law in December 2015 and reauthorizes the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1956 (ESEA), includes additional right to know requests. At any time, parents and family members can request:

- Information on policies regarding student participation in assessments and procedures for opting out, and
- Information on required assessments that include
 - subject matter tested,
 - purpose of the test,
 - source of the requirement (if applicable),
 - amount of time it takes students to complete the test, and
 - time and format of disseminating results.

Our staff is committed to helping your child develop the academic knowledge and critical thinking he/she needs to succeed in school and beyond. That commitment includes making sure that all of our teachers and paraprofessionals meet applicable Pennsylvania state requirements.
