Volunteering


Opportunities throughout the school year will allow us to welcome volunteers into the classrooms and school. In order to be eligible to volunteer, the following is required:

Right to Know

As a parent of a student attending a school that is receiving Federal Title I dollars, you have the right to know the professional qualifications of the teacher(s) and instructional paraprofessional(s) who instruct your child. Federal law requires every Title I school district to comply and to provide you with the requested information in a timely manner. We are happy to provide this information to you. At any time, you may ask:

- Whether the teacher met state qualifications and certification requirements for the grade level and subject he/she is teaching, ≫
- Whether the teacher received an emergency or conditional certificate through which state qualifications were waived, and ≫
- What undergraduate or graduate degrees the teacher holds, including graduate certificates and additional degrees, and major(s) or area(s) of concentration.

You may also ask whether your child receives help from a paraprofessional. If your child receives this assistance, we can provide you with information about the paraprofessional's qualifications. Breakfast & Lunch

Strodes Mills was approved as a Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) school for SY 2023-24. This allows all SMES students to receive a FREE breakfast and lunch each school day. Free/reduced meal applications will not be distributed to SMES students. Instead, you will receive an economic info survey. This survey is very important, so please be sure to send it back to school with your student. Students who are eligible for free and reduced lunch may request an application for instructional supplies by contacting the main office/principal.

Curriculum

Mifflin County School District School Board Policy 105.1 requires annual notification to parents/guardians and students that parents/guardians and students have an opportunity to review instructional materials and have access to information about the curriculum, including academic standards to be achieved, instructional materials and assessment techniques.
