A Message From Mr. Campagna

Huskies Helping Huskies - This is an after-school tutoring program for our students at MCHS. Sessions are held on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday of each week from 3:30-4:30 in Library Lab E. Teachers will be available to help students with homework, test preparation, additional instruction, Google Classroom, etc. Students do not need to sign up ahead of time to attend, and they will need to have their own transportation home.

A few procedural items to keep in mind.

- 1. Attendance Students will either scan their ID cards or enter their ID number in the morning at one of the attendance stations at the front of the school.
- 2. Students must submit a note to the main office prior to leaving the building for all early dismissals. Notes may be submitted during their homeroom/first period class. Failure to provide a note prior to leaving the building for an early dismissal will result in disciplinary action from the office. Excuses must be written and signed by the pupil's parent, guardian or person in parental standing. Pupils (Regardless Of Age) may not write and sign their own excuses.
- 3. When writing excuses for absences, please make sure you put your child's full name and grade on the excuse. In addition, I want to remind you that you can email either assistant principal or me with

FAFSA: The FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) is changing again. The FAFSA is the application seniors complete to apply for financial aid for post-secondary education. The FAFSA will not open until December 1 (previous date was October 1st). MCHS will offer a Financial Aid General Information Night for students and parents on November 2nd at 7 PM.

Mifflin County High School's Guidance Office will be hosting a Financial Aid General Information Night on Thursday, November 2 at 7:00 PM. This is an opportunity for seniors and their parents/guardians to learn about the different types of financial aid and how to apply for them. Jamie Kosh, the Senior Manager at the Office of Student Aid at Penn State, will be presenting the information and will be on hand after the presentation to answer any questions. A FAFSA Completion Night event is planned for February. Additional information about that will be disseminated at a later date.

Picture Day

Senior Picture Makeups/Retakes are Thursday, November 2nd. There is no order form for seniors, but students will have the opportunity to order portrait packages online four weeks after their portrait session. Students DO NOT need to sign up ahead of time for senior portrait sessions. They will be called down by homeroom teacher. (If they miss November 2nd, they can get them taken on November 3rd, but it will be the absolute LAST day.)

Final Picture Makeup/Retake Day for ALL Students and Staff is Friday, November 3rd. 10th & 11th graders can pick up a picture order form from Mrs. Clancy-Burns' room (B214), the Main Office, or the Guidance

Office. Parents/Guardians can also order online at strawbridge.net. If a student is getting retakes, they MUST hand in their original picture package. Alpha students are welcome to come in any time between 8:30 a.m. - 1 p.m. All other students will be called down by homeroom. November 3rd is the absolute LAST day for picture makeups/retakes for all students and staff. There will be no other picture days scheduled this year.

Homeless Awareness Week

Schools and communities across the nation set aside the week before Thanksgiving to recognize the challenges faced by those experiencing homelessness. Under federal law, children are considered homeless if they lack a fixed, regular, or adequate nighttime residence. Many people associate being homeless with living on the street, but homelessness is often hidden, especially in rural communities.

An average of 100 students are identified as homeless in Mifflin County School District each year. To assist those in need, MCSD staff will be raising money for the district's student homelessness fund. In exchange for a \$5 donation, staff will be able to dress down on Friday, November 17th and are encouraged to wear a red shirt to spread awareness.

If you or your child would like to join in the effort, monetary donations can be sent to the Administration Building, located at 201 8th Street in Lewistown to the attention of Michelle Siruc, the district's homeless liaison. Checks can be made out to Mifflin County School District. Funds are used to purchase clothing, toiletries, and school supplies for displaced students. You can also show your support by wearing a red shirt on Friday, November 17th.

If you are experiencing homelessness, please know that help is available. Please reach out to your child's teacher, principal, nurse, or counselor. They will connect you with one of the district's social workers, who can assist you with securing necessary resources.

From the Nurse's Office

Dear Parents and Guardians,

As your student prepares for the final years of high school, please note the following PA Department of Health school health requirements:

11th Grade Physical Examination: The school nurse will accept a private physical examination completed during the student's sophomore year, a sports pre-participation physical, driver's license physical (DL-180 Form), or a private physical examination completed by the student's healthcare provider. Private Physician Physical forms can be picked up in the nurse's office or obtained on the MCSD website (Student/Parents > Nurses > Forms & Policies > Private Physician Physical Form). Submitted physicals should not be dated prior to September 1, 2022.

12th Grade Meningococcal Vaccination (MCV): Prior to the 2024-2025 school year, every student entering 12th grade must have one dose of the MCV (meningococcal vaccination) by the first day of 12th grade. This dose is in addition to the one required for 7th grade. If one dose was given after 16 years of age or older, that shall count as the 12th grade dose. If a student is not compliant with or appropriately exempted prior to the start of the 2024-2025 school year, the student will be excluded from school until either compliance is reached or an appropriate exemption is submitted.

Please submit physical exam forms and immunization documentation to the school nurse.

Student Assistance Program (SAP)

The MCHS Student Assistance Program (SAP) Team is a group of professionals dedicated to helping to identify and assist students who may be struggling with life issues that are interfering with school performance. The SAP team consists of teachers, administrators, school counselors, social workers, nurses, and representatives from community agencies who have been specially trained to work with students and make appropriate referrals. This help is provided in a completely non-disciplinary way.

Based on the diverse needs of our students, this process may include an interview with a member of the SAP team, a counseling group, or individual counseling with the school-based therapist or social worker. Services may include academic support; behavior management; drug and alcohol education, prevention, assessment and treatment through Clear Concepts; anger management; mental health assessment through the Youth Advocate Program; conflict resolution, or involvement in community agencies. All SAP-related services are free and confidential. A parent or guardian must sign a permission for SAP services. Any student, parent, or teacher may make a referral. If you have concerns for a MCSD student in grades K-12, please contact an administrator, school counselor, or school nurse.
