A Message From Mr. Campagna

Crosson named Pa. Teacher of the Year - Article courtesy of the Lewistown Sentinel

HERSHEY — Mifflin County High School teacher Ashlie Crosson wears a lot of hats throughout her day: 10th grade English teacher, Advanced Placement Language teacher, journalism teacher and digital publications advisor, to name a few.

She added a very prestigious one to her ensemble on Monday.

Crosson was named the 2024 Pennsylvania Teacher of the Year during the Pennsylvania Department of Education's annual professional development conference, which is sponsored by the DOE and the Pennsylvania chapter of the National State Teacher of the Year, in Hershey.

"I do what I do, and I teach what I teach because we have incredible students, an incredible faculty and an incredible community," said Crosson, who was chosen from a field of 12 finalists. "I'm really excited to bring Pennsylvania home to us."

Mifflin County School District Superintendent of Schools Vance Varner said the award is testament to the dedication of Crosson and other teachers in the district to their profession.

"It's a huge accomplishment for Ashlie, but it's also [a] huge accomplishment for the Mifflin County School District," he explained. "I'm so proud of her."

"We have an incredible staff – over 800 staff in our district," he added. "They're all great; they all deserve awards. Today one of ours was separated as being one of the best teachers of 12, and ultimately the Pennsylvania Teacher of the Year for 2024."

"To my knowledge, we have not had anybody as a finalist before," he added.

Crosson received the award at the conclusion of a two-day ceremony in Hershey for this year's finalists. The Pennsylvania Teacher of the Year program honors excellence in teaching by teachers in kindergarten through 12th grade in public education, who have made outstanding academic contributions to school-aged children in the state.

The 12 finalists were selected from applicants that have been nominated by their community. Crosson is now Pennsylvania's entry in the National Teacher of the Year, which culminates with a ceremony at the White House.

After graduating from Lewistown Area High School in 2007, Crosson received her bachelor's degree in English, with a minor in journalism, as well as her secondary English teaching certificate from Susquehanna University in 2011. She then completed her master's degree from Penn State in educational leadership in 2015. Most recently, she earned her certificate in gifted education from Millersville University.

With more than 13 years of teaching experience, this nomination – and now state honor – has been one of the many highlights in Crosson's career.

Crosson, who was nominated by two of her former colleagues in Bellefonte, felt a tremendous sense of pride when hearing her name announced as the 2024 winner. The process had been long, with many rounds to determine this year's honoree.

The 12 finalists had been notified in June. For Crosson, it was certainly worth the wait being named as the Teacher of the Year.

"I went through the eliminations because I want Mifflin County to be known for its students and its teachers," Crosson explained. "A lot of people helped me through all of the eliminations. For me, this is a team win."

And her first reaction?

"A lot of disbelief," Crosson recalled. "The other 11 finalists are also remarkable educators. I'm really first among equals, that's very true."

Being in Hershey for the event was really a rewarding experience for the finalists.

"Coming here is really celebrating that accomplishment," Crosson said. "What we've done for our classrooms and students is worth acknowledging. This is a job. This is a daily grind. These two days were about celebrating that accomplishment.

"It's about teachers whether they have a handful or hundreds of students, and have a hundred tasks to do,"

she added.

Crosson said the real work starts as she will have obligations, such as speaking engagements, as the Teacher of the Year. The winner serves a two-year term.

After being named as the winner, Crosson hugged 2022 Pennsylvania Teacher of the Year recipient Elizabeth Raff, who teaches sixth-grade English language arts and social students.

Crosson said Raff gave her some sage words of advice. "She gave me a hug and said, 'Stand here for [a] minute, don't move,'" Crosson said.

Crosson listened, enjoying the moment.



Statement from Mr. Varner - If the Mifflin County School District is in session and a parent/guardian determines that the roads are "unsafe" to travel due to poor weather conditions, the parent/guardian is permitted to have the student(s) remain at home for the day. Excuses must be written and signed by the pupil's parent, guardian or person in parental standing. Pupils (Regardless Of Age) may not write and sign their own excuses.

Medical Careers Club Visits PSU Cadaver Lab

The Medical Careers Club was invited to attend a unique experience at Penn State University's cadaver lab. Dr. John Waters, teaching professor of Biology, Anthropology, and Associate Head for Biology Undergraduate Education, and his staff welcomed 30 of our club students for a day of exploring and learning.

Dr. Waters explained the importance of treating the cadaver donors with respect, as they are a gift for learning, "...a teacher without words...." Students were given the opportunity for hands-on, interactive participation with all 4 donors from the outside to the inside of the body. This was the most authentic experience a student could have to be able to make connections between the classroom and real life.


Students also interacted with an ECG machine. They practiced setting up the wires and analyzing the data.

They learned how each peak on the data correlated to what was going on in the heart in live time, and how the cardiovascular system works.

In addition, students were introduced to ultrasound. They participated in scanning various organs on a patient and interpreting the images on the analyzer. They were able to relate the images to the actual parts in the donor.

Overall, this was the ultimate experience in medicine and anatomy/physiology a high school student could encounter. This was a real-world experience in their pockets for future careers and understanding.

From the Nurse's Office

Dear Parents and Guardians,

As your student prepares for the final years of high school, please note the following PA Department of Health school health requirements:

11th Grade Physical Examination: The school nurse will accept a private physical examination completed during the student's sophomore year, a sports pre-participation physical, driver's license physical (DL-180 Form), or a private physical examination completed by the student's healthcare provider. Private Physician Physical forms can be picked up in the nurse's office or obtained on the MCSD website (Student/Parents > Nurses > Forms & Policies > Private Physician Physical Form). Submitted physicals should not be dated prior to September 1, 2022.

12th Grade Meningococcal Vaccination (MCV): Prior to the 2024-2025 school year, every student entering 12th grade must have one dose of the MCV (meningococcal vaccination) by the first day of 12th grade. This dose is in addition to the one required for 7th grade. If one dose was given after 16 years of age or older, that shall count as the 12th grade dose. If a student is not compliant with or appropriately exempted prior to the start of the 2024-2025 school year, the student will be excluded from school until either compliance is reached or an appropriate exemption is submitted.

Please submit physical exam forms and immunization documentation to the school nurse.

Student Assistance Program (SAP)

The MCHS Student Assistance Program (SAP) Team is a group of professionals dedicated to helping to identify and assist students who may be struggling with life issues that are interfering with school performance. The SAP team consists of teachers, administrators, school counselors, social workers, nurses, and representatives from community agencies who have been specially trained to work with students and make appropriate referrals. This help is provided in a completely non-disciplinary way.

Based on the diverse needs of our students, this process may include an interview with a member of the SAP team, a counseling group, or individual counseling with the school-based therapist or social worker. Services may include academic support; behavior management; drug and alcohol education, prevention, assessment and treatment through Clear Concepts; anger management; mental health assessment through the Youth Advocate Program; conflict resolution, or involvement in community agencies. All SAP-related services are free and confidential. A parent or guardian must sign a permission for SAP services. Any student, parent, or teacher may make a referral. If you have concerns for a MCSD student in grades K-12, please contact an administrator, school counselor, or school nurse.
