Positive Attendance Procedures 2025-26

Students at MCMS will be verifying attendance as they enter the building using check-in kiosks.

Students will scan their ID badge barcode or type their student ID number on a kiosk.

This is similar to the process used for purchasing lunch and/or signing in or out of the building for appointments.

Kiosks will be located in the cafeteria (parent drop-off area), in the auditorium lobby (bus drop-off area), and in the office.

This is a system that will help us create a more secure environment where we will be able to confirm attendance as soon as students enter the building. Teachers will then verify the attendance in first period and notify the office of any discrepancies.

Student Drop-Off/Pick-Up

- During school hours (after 8:08 a.m.) students should be dropped off and/or picked up at the front office. If a student has already submitted an excuse for an early dismissal, a parent/guardian does <u>not</u> have to come into the building to pick up his or her student. Students are able to sign themselves in and out with an excuse signed by a parent/guardian. Parents/guardians may either pick up students in the office or they may call and students will be sent out to meet the parent/guardian after their identity has been verified.
- Before and after school, students are to be dropped off and/or picked up at the cafeteria parking lot next to the athletic practice fields. Students will enter and exit through Door #17 into the cafeteria. Students should <u>not</u> be picked up at the auditorium parking lot. This lot is for buses only.

Personal Problems

Google Classroom

Google Classroom and Class Dojo are both popular tools used in schools, but they serve different purposes and have distinct features. As a middle school parent familiar with Class Dojo, you may find Google Classroom to be more academically oriented, while Class Dojo continues to support engagement and behavior tracking. Below is a comparison to help you understand the differences:

Feature/Aspect	Google Classroom	Class Dojo
Purpose	Learning Management System (LMS)	Classroom Management and Communication Tool
Assignments & Grading	Full functionality for creating, distributing, and grading assignments	Not designed for academic assignments; focuses on behavior and engagement
Communication	Announcements and academic discussions	Real-time behavior updates, photos, and announcements
Parent Engagement	Limited to academic updates and announcements	Strong focus with direct communication and updates

Lockers

Students are encouraged to use their lockers throughout the day. Below are steps for opening your locker. We encourage you to review these with your student.

- 1. Clear the lock by turning several times clockwise and then stop on the first number of your combination.
- 2. Next, turn counterclockwise passing the second number once and stopping on it the second time around.
- 3. Lastly, turn clockwise and stop at the last number. Lift the handle to open the locker door.

*HINT: Stop directly on the numbers of the combination or it may not open.

From the Nurse's Office

6th **Grade Vaccinations and Physical Examination:** The school nurse will accept a completed physical examination with the student's healthcare provider from up to one year prior to the first day of school this year or at any time during the sixth-grade year. A copy of the child's immunization record must be completed and turned in with the physical. Students may request physical examination forms in the school nurse's office, or they can be downloaded and printed from the district's webpage.

As a friendly reminder, students are NOT permitted to carry any prescriptions or over-the-counter medications on their persons during school hours. The only medications students may carry with a physician's order are epi-pens, diabetic supplies, or inhalers. Parents and guardians must deliver medications to the school nurse in the original prescription bottles or packaging along with the MCSD prescription medication form completed by the prescribing physician. Please call Nurse Staub at 717-248-1401 ext. 6509 or email at jis20@mcsdk12.org if your child needs to take any medication at school.

Please call or email the MCMS school nurse throughout the school year if your student has a change in his or her health status and needs any additional support or assistance during school hours. Please also keep in mind, morning medications should be given at home.

** The exclusion date for 7th grade students not compliant with immunizations is September 4th.

7th Grade Dental: The school nurse will accept a dental form dated from up to one year prior to the school start date or anytime during their seventh-grade year. It is a state requirement that every student in 7th grade must have a dental exam. Dental forms can be picked up in the nurse's office or downloaded from the district's webpage.
