From the Guidance Office

Act 158 - Pennsylvania Pathways to Graduation: Please review the attached documents regarding Act 158 Graduation requirements. Should you have any questions regarding the requirements please contact your student's school counselor.

Senior Workshop Night for Parents: The MCHS School Counselors will be holding a Senior Workshop Night for Parents on September 23 at 6 p.m. in the Cafeteria. This evening will give parents an opportunity to learn about the next steps seniors should be taking if they plan to pursue further education after high school at a 4 year college/university, a 2 year college, or a trade/technical school. Parents will learn about the application process, visiting colleges, college entrance exams (SAT and ACT), types of financial aid, basic information for student athletes, and more.

SAT at MCHS on October 4: The SAT will be offered at MCHS on October 4. The registration deadline for this exam is September 19. Students will register online at www.collegeboard.org. Students who qualify for free/reduced price lunches should see their school counselor about obtaining a fee waiver. This will be a digital exam; students will be able to use their school issued devices or personal devices to take the exam.

PSAT at MCHS on October 21: MCHS will offer the PSAT to current 10th and 11th grade students on October 21 during the school day. Sophomores and juniors who want to have extra practice before taking the SAT should consider taking the PSAT. Students in 11th grade who take the PSAT may also qualify for National Merit Scholarships depending on the scores they earn. The cost to take the PSAT is \$18. Sign-ups will be from August 25 until September 24 in the guidance office. Payment is due at the time of registration. Students in 11th grade who qualify for free/reduced price lunches may receive a fee waiver for this exam. There are no fee waivers for 10th grade students. Please see your school counselor with any questions.

Financial Aid General Information Night: The MCHS Financial Aid General Information Night will be held Tuesday, October 7 at 7 PM in the MCHS Cafeteria. This is a night for parents to learn about the different types of financial aid and how to apply for them from experts in the field. Jamie Kosh and Craig Dietrich from Penn State's Financial Aid Office will be presenting this evening. Please see your child's school counselor with any questions.

PSAT Exam: The PSAT exam will be offered at MCHS on October 21 to 10th and 11th grade students. Students will register with the Guidance Office for that exam. Additional information will be given to 10th and 11th grade students in homerooms on the first day of school and posted on the MCHS website by the end of the first week of school.

ASVAB Exam: The ASVAB exam will be offered at MCHS on October 23rd during the school day. Students will register for the exam in the guidance office by Friday, October 3rd. The ASVAB is a free exam offered to all students in 11th and 12th grade. The ASVAB offers valuable information on career guidance, and can be counted as a Keystone Graduation pathway.

Student College Workshop: The MCHS School Counselors will be holding a Senior Workshop in the library on Friday, October 3rd during the school day. This workshop will help students navigate college applications, learn about sending transcripts, and get one on one assistance from the counselors. A representative will be coming from The Commonwealth University of Pennsylvania (Locke Haven, Bloomsburg, Mansfield) to offer an instant decision to students interested in applying.

Class Dues: Students are required to pay class dues (\$10.00 per academic year) if they attend any of the dances at Mifflin County High School (Sadie's, Homecoming, Senior Dinner Dance, Prom). Dues are collected when a student purchases his or her ticket to the dance. Dues are separate from the price of the dance ticket. The dues are paid once a year--\$10.00 per year, NOT per dance. They can also be paid for an entire high school career--\$30.00 in total for all three years of high school. If your student does not plan on attending any of the dances during their high school career, dues are not required. Class dues can be paid in the guidance office.

From the Nurse's Office

Dear Parents and Guardians,

As your student prepares for the final years of high school, please note the following PA Department of Health school health requirements:

11th Grade Physical Examination: The school nurse will accept a private physical examination completed during the student's sophomore year, a sports pre-participation physical, driver's license physical (DL-180 Form), or a private physical examination completed by the student's healthcare provider. Private Physician Physical forms can be picked up in the nurse's office or obtained on the MCSD website (Student/Parents > Nurses > Forms & Policies > Private Physician Physical Form). Submitted physicals should not be dated prior to September 1, 2022. Physicals should be submitted to the school nurse by May 15, 2025.

12th Grade Meningococcal Vaccination (MCV): Prior to the 2025-2026 school year, every student entering 12th grade must have one dose of the MCV (meningococcal vaccination) by the first day of 12th grade. This dose is in addition to the one required for 7th grade and must be given after the student turns 16 years old. Students in the Alpha program are also required to obtain this immunization. If the student is not compliant with immunization requirements or appropriately exempted prior to the start of their senior year, the student will be excluded from school on September 3, 2025, and after until either compliance is documented, or an appropriate exemption is submitted.

Please submit physical exam forms and immunization documentation to the school nurse.

Medications at School:

If your child requires daily prescription, over-the-counter, or as needed medication during school hours, a new physician order must be submitted to the school nurse <u>EACH</u> school year before the school nurse may administer medications at school.

According to state guidelines and MCSD policy, students may only self-carry an Epipen, asthma inhaler, and diabetic supplies if a physician order is on file in the nurse's office.

Students are NOT permitted to carry any other medications on their person during school hours. This includes cough drops, medicated creams, eye drops, or anything used for medicinal purposes.

Any medication that is required to be taken at school <u>MUST</u> be transported to and from school by a parent/guardian or designated adult and accompanied with a physician's order. Medications must be in a labeled bottle or original packaging from the pharmacy. Parents or designated adults are required to sign medications into the nurse's office at drop-off.

Other Medical Accommodations:

If your child has asthma, food allergies, or other life-threatening allergies requiring the use of antihistamines or an Epipen, please submit an asthma action plan, allergy action plan or food allergy form signed by your child's physician.

These forms may be found on the mcsdk12.org website > Students/Parents > Nurses > Forms & Policies.

These forms need to be submitted annually to the nurse's office.

Mandated Health Screenings:

State mandated health screenings for hearing, vision, and growth are scheduled for November 17-20, 2026. Please ensure your child attends school during this time and has prescribed glasses, contacts, or hearing aids.

Student Assistance Program (SAP)

The MCHS Student Assistance Program (SAP) Team is a group of professionals dedicated to helping to identify and assist students who may be struggling with life issues that are interfering with school performance. The SAP team consists of teachers, administrators, school counselors, social workers, nurses, and representatives from community agencies who have been specially trained to work with students and make appropriate referrals. This help is provided in a completely non-disciplinary way.

Based on the diverse needs of our students, this process may include an interview with a member of the SAP team, a counseling group, or individual counseling with the school-based therapist or social worker. Services may include academic support; behavior management; drug and alcohol education, prevention, assessment and treatment through Clear Concepts; anger management; mental health assessment through the Youth Advocate Program; conflict resolution, or involvement in community agencies. All SAP-related services are free and confidential. A parent or guardian must sign a permission for SAP services. Any student, parent, or teacher may make a referral. If you have concerns for a MCSD student in grades K-12, please contact an administrator, school counselor, or school nurse.

Mifflin County School District School Board Policy 105.1

Mifflin County School District School Board Policy 105.1 requires annual notification to parents/guardians and students that parents/guardians and students have an opportunity to review instructional materials and have access to information about the curriculum, including academic standards to be achieved, instructional materials and assessment techniques. Requests to review instructional materials and access information about the curriculum, including academic standards to be achieved, instructional materials and assessment techniques should be made by submitting a written request to the building principal.

Mifflin County School District School Board Policy 110

The building principal will be responsible to ensure that no student in the school is denied participation in any school program for financial reasons and that the privacy of each student is protected.

The principal will use the guidelines of the free and reduced price lunch program to determine the ability of students to provide necessary school supplies.

Parents/Guardians must complete the Application For Instructional Supplies and submit required documentation when requesting free instructional supplies for students. Please contact the principal for more information and to request the application.

Dear Parents/Guardians,

In 2018, Act 158 was signed into law outlining state graduation requirements and the ways in which Keystone Exams factor into these requirements. State graduation requirements are effective for students in the Classes of 2023 and beyond. In order to graduate from high school, students must meet all local graduation requirements related to credits and coursework along with the state requirements outlined in Act 158. Students must meet one of Pennsylvania's five pathways outlined below to earn a diploma and demonstrate career and/or college readiness.

ACT 158 – State Graduation Pathways

For students graduating in 2023 and beyond, the following pathway options exist to meet state graduation requirements:

- <u>Keystone Proficiency Pathway:</u> Scoring proficient or advanced on all three Keystone Exams (Algebra I, Literature, and Biology)
- **Keystone Composite Pathway:** Earning a satisfactory three composite score (4452) on the Algebra I, Literature, and Biology Keystone Exams (while achieving at least one proficient/advanced score and no score of below basic on the remaining two) OR, earning a non-numeric Proficient on a Keystone Exam and attain a satisfactory composite score of 2939 on two of the three Keystone Exams (must score proficient on one of two exams and no less than basic on other one)
- <u>Alternate Assessment Pathway:</u> Successful completion of locally established, grade-based requirements for academic content areas associated with each Keystone Exam (i.e. passing final course grades in Algebra I, Biology, and English 10) and one of the following:
 - O Attainment of an established score on an approved alternate assessment:
 - SAT (1010), PSAT (970), ACT (21), ASVAB (31)
 - o Gold Level on the ACT WorkKeys Assessment
 - Attainment of 3 or better on an Advanced Placement Program exam in an academic content area associated with each Keystone Exam on which the student did not achieve at least a proficient score

- Successful completion of a concurrent enrollment course (college dual enrollment class) in an academic content area associated with each Keystone Exam in which the student did not achieve at least a proficient score
- O Successful completion of a pre-apprenticeship program
- Acceptance in an accredited 4-year nonprofit institution of higher education and evidence of the ability to enroll in college-level coursework
- Evidence Based Pathway: Successful completion of locally established, grade-based requirements for academic content areas associated with each Keystone Exam (i.e., passing final course grades in Algebra I, Biology, and English 10) and demonstration of three pieces of evidence consistent with the student's goals and career plans, including:
 - ONE or more of the following:
 - Attainment of 630 or better on any SAT Subject Area Test
 - Attainment of Silver Level on the ACT WorkKeys assessment
 - Attainment of 3 or better on any Advanced Placement Program Exam
 - Acceptance to an other-than-4-year Institution of Higher Education (IHE) for college-level coursework
 - Attainment of an industry-recognized credential
 - Successful completion of any concurrent enrollment or postsecondary course
 - O And no more than TWO additional pieces of evidence from the following:
 - Satisfactory completion of a service-learning project
 - Attainment of a score of proficient or advanced on any Keystone Exam
 - Letter guaranteeing full-time employment or military enlistment
 - Successful completion of an internship or cooperative education program
 - Satisfactory compliance with the NCAA's Division II academic requirements
- <u>Career and Technical Education Pathway:</u> Career and Technical Education (CTE) Concentrators (Mifflin County Academy of Science and Technology Students): Successful completion of locally established, grade-based requirements for academic content areas associated with each Keystone Exam (i.e., passing final course grades in Algebra I, Biology, and English 10) and ONE of the following:
 - o Attainment of an industry-based competency certification
 - Demonstration of the high likelihood of success on an industry-based competency assessment
 - o Readiness for continued engagement in the CTE Concentrator's program of study


School counselors will be working closely with each student to review and help students decide which pathway is best to meet this state-wide graduation requirement.

Waiver

A student in 12th grade, or experiencing extenuating circumstances, who meets locally established grade-based requirements for Keystone content area(s) in which the student is less than proficient, and is unable to satisfy the requirements of a graduation pathway may be granted a waiver by the chief school administrator.

Individualized Education Plan

A student with a disability who is unable to satisfy pathway requirements but who satisfactorily completes a special education program is granted a diploma under Title 22 §4.24.
