Nurse's Office Update

Dear Parents and Guardians.

The Pennsylvania School Code requires that all school-age children must have a physical and dental on le upon entry of school, Kindergarten, and in addition a 3rd grade dental exam must be completed as well. This must be on le no later than May 1, 2026 for the 25-26 school year.

Information for the 25-26 School Year:

Vision, Hearing, Height, Weight, and BMI screenings will be held September 24-26th, 2025



Mobile Dentist will be at IVES on November 20 -21st, 2025 November 24- 25th, 2025 If you have not completed paperwork and would be interested in having your child seen please contact the school nurse.

2nd Grade Students: All student's entering 3rd grade are required to have a 3rd grade dental exam completed and on le. It is preferred to have your private dentist complete the exam. With that being said, we realize parents/guardians may have diculty obtaining dental care for different reasons. The Mi in County School District also has the option of your child being seen by Geisinger Dental or the Mobile Dentist at school. If this is the option you prefer parent permission forms must be completed for the 25-26 school year. Dental exams may be completed up to one

Dental forms and more information will be sent home with students this spring.

5th Grade Students: Your child will have the opportunity to attend Outdoor School this fall (more information to come). If you child will need medications to be administered at Outdoor School all prescription medications, as well as **ALL** over-the-counter medications <u>will require an order from a licensed prescriber and a signed consent form from a parent/guardian.</u> Any student that requires medication and does not provide a licensed prescribers order, <u>will not</u> be permitted to attend the trip. All medication must be brought to school by a parent/guardian in the original container.

<u>Over-the-Counter Medication</u> forms were sent home with students on August 25, 2025. This form must be completed and signed by a parent/guardian in order for students to receive medication from the school nurse. If your child has not submitted the Over-the Counter mediation from to the Nurse's Office, your child will not receive medication at school. Forms are available in the nurse office.

As a reminder, students are NOT permitted to carry on them or bring any medications to school. This includes cough drops, medicated creams, eye drops, or anything used for medicinal purposes.

Any medication that is required to be taken as school **MUST** be transported to school by a parent/guardian or designated adult and accompanied with a physician's order. Parents and guardians are required to sign medications into the nurse's o ce at drop-off.

If your child requires any medication at school, a new physician order MUST be submitted to the school EACH school year before your child can be administered medication. This includes inhalers, epi pens, or any medication. Failure to do so is a violation of the MCSD Medication Policy.

When your child is absent:

- -Notes must be turned in within three school days of the student being absent.
- -If a note is NOT received, the day becomes an unlawful absence.

Unlawful Absences

-After a student's **4th unlawful absence** - School Attendance Improvement Conference must be held with parent/guardian and administration to develop a School Attendance Improvement Plan.

-After a student's **6th unlawful absence** - a truancy referral is made to **Children and Youth Services** and **Clarvida** (formerly Raystown Developmental Service) and a Truancy Elimination Plan is created.

- -Calling the o ce does NOT count as the excuse. We must have written documentation.

Board Policy 105.1 Notification - Review of Instructional Materials


