Lockdown Drill: There will be a lockdown drill on Wednesday, November 5, 2025, at 9:30 a.m. during the second period at MCHS. Local law enforcement has been invited to participate.

Huskies Helping Huskies - This is an after-school tutoring program for our students at MCHS. Sessions are held on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday of each week from 3:30-4:30 p.m. in Library Lab E. Teachers will be available to help students with homework, test preparation, additional instruction, Google Classroom, etc. Students do not need to sign up ahead of time to attend, and they will need to have their own transportation home.

From the Guidance Office

SAT at MCHS on October 4: The October SAT will be offered at MCHS on October 4. Registered students will need to report to the main lobby to get to their testing room—doors will open at 7:30 a.m. Please reach out to your student's school counselor with any questions.

PSAT at MCHS on October 21: MCHS will offer the PSAT to current 10th and 11th grade students on October 21 during the school day. Sophomores and juniors who want to have extra practice before taking the SAT should consider taking the PSAT. Students in 11th grade who take the PSAT may also qualify for National Merit Scholarships depending on the scores they earn. The cost to take the PSAT is \$18. Sign-ups will be from August 25 until September 24 in the guidance office. Payment is due at the time of registration. Students in 11th grade who qualify for free/reduced price lunches may receive a fee waiver for this exam. There are no fee waivers for 10th grade students. Please see your school counselor with any questions.

Financial Aid General Information Night: The MCHS Financial Aid Night will be held Tuesday, October 7 at 7 p.m. in the MCHS Cafeteria. Seniors planning to pursue a post-secondary education after graduation along with their parents are encouraged to attend to learn about the different types of financial aid and how to apply for them. Please reach out to your student's school counselor with any questions.

PSAT Exam: The PSAT exam will be offered at MCHS on October 21 to 10th and 11th grade students. Students will register with the Guidance Office for that exam. Additional information will be given to 10th and 11th grade students in homerooms on the first day of school and posted on the MCHS website by the end of the first week of school.

ASVAB Exam: The ASVAB exam will be offered at MCHS on October 23rd during the school day. Students will register for the exam in the guidance office by Friday, October 3rd. The ASVAB is a free exam offered to all students in 11th and 12th grade. The ASVAB offers valuable information on career guidance, and can be counted as a Keystone Graduation pathway.

Student College Workshop: The MCHS School Counselors will be holding a Senior Workshop in the library on Friday, October 3rd during the school day. This workshop will help students navigate college applications, learn about sending transcripts, and get one on one assistance from the counselors. A representative will be coming from The Commonwealth University of Pennsylvania (Locke Haven, Bloomsburg, Mansfield) to offer an instant decision to students interested in applying.

November SAT Registration Deadline: The SAT will be offered at MCHS on November 8. The registration deadline for that exam is October 24. Students are encouraged to check with the college they are planning to attend after graduation to see if it is required. Students must register online through www.collegeboard.org, and this will be a digital exam that can be taken on a school issued device. Students should speak with their school counselor if there are any questions.

FAFSA Completion Night: The MCHS Guidance will be hosting a FAFSA Completion Night on Thursday, November 6 at 6 p.m. in the MCHS Cafeteria. During this event, seniors planning to attend a post-secondary institution after high school and their parents can get assistance in completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). This application must be completed in order to apply for financial assistance to pay for college. Representatives from various local colleges and universities will be available to help through this process. Attendees will need to register for this event ahead of time—please reach out to the MCHS Guidance Office after October 13 to register.

**To the parents who attended the MCHS Senior Workshop for parents—please note that you were given the incorrect date for this event at the workshop held on 9/23. We do apologize for that mistake.

Class Dues: Students are required to pay class dues (\$10.00 per academic year) if they attend any of the dances at Mifflin County High School (Sadie's, Homecoming, Senior Dinner Dance, Prom). Dues are collected when a student purchases his or her ticket to the dance. Dues are separate from the price of the dance ticket. The dues are paid once a year--\$10.00 per year, NOT per dance. They can also be paid for an entire high school career--\$30.00 in total for all three years of high school. If your student does not plan on attending any of the dances during their high school career, dues are not required. Class dues can be paid in the guidance office.

Tickets must be purchased during this time in room B318 (from Mr. Hepner), Second floor B wing (from Mr. Stine), or the Guidance office (from Mrs. McCarter). No tickets will be sold after these two weeks, and tickets cannot be purchased at the door on the day of the dance.

This is a Mifflin County High School dance for students in grades 10-12. Students bringing dates that are not current Mifflin County High School students will need to fill out the guest form before they purchase tickets. Tickets will be \$10.

School Pictures and Yearbook Information

Fall Pictures: Picture Day for 10th & 11th grade students will be on Monday, October 6th. Picture forms were sent home with students on September 26th during morning homerooms. Pictures can also be ordered online at strawbridge.net. Students MUST adhere to the dress code on picture day. Failure to do so will result in needing to attend Retake Day in October or their picture will not be included in the yearbook portrait section. Students will be called down by homeroom teachers on Picture Day.

Senior Portraits: Any SENIOR student who missed the summer senior portrait sessions can attend Retake/Makeup Day on October 30th. The option for casual photos will not be available on Retake/Makeup Day. There will be no photo form for senior portraits. Proofs will be sent via email to parents 4 weeks after Retake/Makeup Day. Every student's picture MUST be taken at the high school to be included in the yearbook portrait section.

Dear Parents & Guardians,

Over-the-Counter (OTC) Medication Forms were handed out during Homeroom on the first few days of school. If your child did not return a signed OTC Medication Form, the nurse's office is unable to provide your child OTC medication at school. Students may ask for new OTC Medication Forms in the nurse's office if needed.

If your child requires medication not provided on the OTC Medication Form, **ALL** other medication or items used for medicinal purposes requires an order from a licensed healthcare provider. A new physician or provider order must be resubmitted to the school nurse **EACH** school year before the school nurse can administer medications at school.

According to PA medication guidelines for schools, the ONLY medications that students may carry and self-administer are EpiPen autoinjectors, asthma inhalers, and diabetic supplies. These three medications may only be self-carried and self-administered if a current physician order is on file in the nurse's office.

Students ARE NOT permitted to carry any other medications on their person during school hours or school-sponsored activities. This includes cough drops, antibiotics, medicated creams and ointments, eye drops, or any items used for medicinal purposes.

Any medication that is required to be administered at school must be transported to and from school by a parent, guardian, or designated adult and accompanied with a physician order.

Prescription medications must be in a labeled prescription bottle. OTC medication should be in sealed, new packaging. No more than a 30-day supply will be stored in the nurse's office. All medications will be counted with the parent or designated adult.

Please make arrangements with Mrs. Grabill RN or Mrs. Moist LPN before delivering medication to MCHS. Front Office Staff are unable to accept medication from parents. Please call or email the MCHS School Nurses with questions regarding medications.

Mandated Health Screenings

The PA Division of School Health requires annual health screenings for school age students.

Growth, vision, and hearing screenings are scheduled at MCHS on November 17 through November 20, 2025. Please ensure your child attends school during this time and is wearing prescribed glasses, contacts, or hearing aids.

<u>11th Grade Private Physical Examination:</u> The school nurse will accept a private physical examination completed during the student's sophomore year, a sports pre-participation physical, a driver's license physical (DL-180) or a private physical examination completed by the student's healthcare provider. Private Physician Physical forms can be picked up in the nurse's office or obtained on the MCSD homepage (Student/Parents > Nurses > Forms & Policies > Private Physician Physical Form).

Submitted physicals should not be dated prior to September 1, 2024. Physicals should be submitted to the school nurse's office by May 15, 2026.

<u>12th Grade Meningococcal Vaccine (MCV):</u> Prior to your child's senior year, every student over the age of 16 years is required to have a dose of the MCV for entry into 12th grade.

This dose is in addition to MCV given for entry into 7th grade. All incoming seniors enrolled in MCSD (including Alpha students) are required to submit proof of vaccination prior to their senior year. Religious and medical exemptions are also accepted.

Parents and guardians of 11th grade students, please make arrangements to have your child's 12th grade MCV completed this school year if your child is 16 years or older. Please submit proof of immunization or exemptions to the nurse's office prior to your child's senior year starting in August 2026. If your child is not compliant with immunization requirements or appropriately exempt prior at the start of their senior year (2026 – 2027), the student will be excluded from school until compliance is submitted.

11th Grade School Physicals – March 18, 2025

School physicals are performed by our school physician, Dr. C. Cooper, to fulfill the 11th grade physical requirements. Permission forms will be sent home in early 2026 if your child does not have a physician or provider. School physicals are conducted in the nurse's office, are non-invasive, and last approximately 10 minutes.

Student Assistance Program (SAP)

The MCHS Student Assistance Program (SAP) Team is a group of professionals dedicated to helping to identify and assist students who may be struggling with life issues that are interfering with school performance. The SAP team consists of teachers, administrators, school counselors, social workers, nurses, and representatives from community agencies who have been specially trained to work with students and make appropriate referrals. This help is provided in a completely non-disciplinary way.

Based on the diverse needs of our students, this process may include an interview with a member of the SAP team, a counseling group, or individual counseling with the school-based therapist or social worker. Services may include academic support; behavior management; drug and alcohol education, prevention, assessment and treatment through Clear Concepts; anger management; mental health assessment through the Youth Advocate Program; conflict resolution, or involvement in community agencies. All SAP-related services are free and confidential. A parent or guardian must sign a permission for SAP services. Any student, parent, or teacher may make a referral. If you have concerns for a MCSD student in grades K-12, please contact an administrator, school counselor, or school nurse.

Mifflin County School District School Board Policy 105.1

Mifflin County School District School Board Policy 105.1 requires annual notification to parents/guardians and students that parents/guardians and students have an opportunity to review instructional materials and have access to information about the curriculum, including academic standards to be achieved, instructional materials and assessment techniques. Requests to review instructional materials and access information about the curriculum, including academic standards to be achieved, instructional materials and assessment techniques should be made by submitting a written request to the building principal.

Mifflin County School District School Board Policy 110

The building principal will be responsible to ensure that no student in the school is denied participation in any school program for financial reasons and that the privacy of each student is protected.

The principal will use the guidelines of the free and reduced price lunch program to determine the ability of students to provide necessary school supplies.

Parents/Guardians must complete the Application For Instructional Supplies and submit required documentation when requesting free instructional supplies for students. Please contact the principal for more information and to request the application.

Complaint Procedures - 906

Mifflin County High School is committed to maintaining a positive and responsive school environment. If you have a concern or complaint about Board policy and procedures, programs, personnel, operations or facilities, concerns should be addressed directly with the teacher, staff member or administrator involved.
