## MORNING DROPOFF

We need your help to make morning dropoff smoother and safer for everyone. We've experienced frequent traffic backups onto Chestnut Ridge Road, which create safety concerns and delays. Please take a moment to review and follow these important procedures:

- Be ready to exit quickly-students should be seated on the passenger side and have their backpacks ready sot hey can exit the vehicle immediately when you stop along the curb.
- Dropoff Lane- the dropoff lane is for quick goodbyes only.
   Drivers must stay in their vehicles and move forward promptly. Please pull up to the end of the sidewalk (or close to the care in front of you) before letting your child out.
   Avoid leaving large gaps between cars to maximize the number of students being dropped off at once.
- Use parking spaces for more time- if you need to get out of your vehicle, walk your child to the building, or just need a little more time, please use a designated parking space.
- Wait for staff before exiting- for safety reasons, students should not exit vehicles before 7:30 am, when staff are present and on duty outside.

Thank you for your cooperation! Following these procedures helps keep our students safe, traffic flowing, and mornings less stressful for everyone. We appreciate your attention to these guidelines and your continued support in making our school a safe place to start the day!

# VOLUNTEERS

- Upload required clearances and track the expiration dates of each

This streamlined process makes it easier than ever to stay up to date and ready to volunteer with all of your documents and requirements stored in one secure, easy-to-access place.

- PA Criminal History Clearance (Act 34)
  - o valid 5 years
- PA Child Abuse History Clearance (Act 151)
  - o valid 5 years
- Federal Criminal History & Fingerprinting (Act 114)
  - o valid 5 years

(OR Volunteer Affidavit in lieu of Act 114 - <u>restrictions</u> apply— and valid only current school year)

- Volunteer Manual/Packet
- o valid current school year
- · Driver's license or state ID scanned
  - o valid until license/ID expires

# NURSE NOTICES

Over-the-Counter Medication forms were distributed on the first day of school. This form must be completed and signed by a parent/guardian in order for students to receive medication from the school nurse. If your child has not submitted the Over-the-Counter Medication form to the Nurse's Office, your child will not receive medication at school. Forms are available online and in the nurse's office.

As a reminder, students are NOT permitted to carry any medications on their person during school hours. This includes cough drops, medicated creams, eye drops or anything used for medicinal purposes. ANY MEDICATION THAT IS REQUIRED TO BE TAKEN AT SCHOOL MUST BE TRANSPORTED TO AND FROM SCHOOL BY A PARENT/GUARDIAN OR DESIGNATED ADULT AND ACCOMPANIED WITH A PHYSICIAN'S ORDER. Parents and guardians are required to sign medications into the nurse's office at drop-off. Failure to do so is a violation of the MCSD Medication Policy.

#### **REMINDERS:**

- Please work with your child to be able to use the restroom independently.
  - Keep a change of clothes in your child's backpack in case of spills or accidents.
- Students entering kindergarten are required to have a physical and dental exam.
  - Students entering 3<sup>rd</sup> grade are required to have a dental exam.

## BUS SAFFTY

We are receiving a high number of bus referrals for the short time we have been in school. We expect SMES students to continue respectful, responsible, ready, and SAFE on the bus in addition to at school.

Consequences- phone calls home, loss of recess or riding privileges, or other consequences to ensure the safety of all students. We take these behaviors seriously & appreciate your support in helping your child understand the importance of bus safety, including:

- Talking quietly to avoid distracting the bus driver
- Using kind words to create a positive environment
- Keeping hands to self
- Not causing any damage to the bus or its equipment
- Not moving seats once seated
- No eating or drinking
- Staying seated at all times during the ride

Talk regularly with your child about their bus ride and encourage them to speak up if they feel or see unsafe behavior. Reinforce the bus rules at home and explain why they matter.

Thank you for partnering with us to teach and reinforce positive behavior. Together, we can ensure a safe journey for every student!

Consistent attendance and being on time are key to a successful school year- and it's a shared responsibility between parents and students.


